Mike & Jane Schallock met as engineering students at the University of Wisconsin. They built a wonderful life together surrounded by their horses, dogs, and the beauty of Star Hill Farm.

In 1965 a group of concerned Waukesha County residents, the Schallocks among them, realized there was a need for a county-wide humane society and shelter for homeless and stray animals. In July of that year, the Humane Animal Welfare Society of Waukesha County was created. Fund-raising and planning by this dedicated group led to HAWS' first facility, which opened in Waukesha in 1969.

Through the years, HAWS' mission has grown to encompass not only animal rescue but also training and education programs, illustrating our founders' dedication to growing a compassionate, humane community.

We are thrilled to introduce you to our next chapter, the HAWS Schallock Center for Animals!

In this newsletter, we highlight the impact the HAWS Schallock Center for Animals will have on our future. Programs there focus on pet training, youth education, and respite and sanctuary for shelter pets. Our popular kids' camps will expand operations, and educational encounters will give even more youth the chance to discover compassion for animals. The Schallock Center will act as a one-of-a-kind pet training facility, as well as a place for pets to receive care and live away from the traditional shelter setting.

We look forward to realizing all of the possibilities of the HAWS Schallock Center for Animals, and we are excited to welcome our community to this amazing new chapter in HAWS history! 🐾

HUMANE EDUCATION HIGHLIGHTS

Growth and New Possibilities

Even with two large meeting rooms and an entire shelter, the in-house programs offered by our Education Department are full to capacity! Camp sessions fill each year, clubs continue to be extremely popular, and most weekends see us hosting several birthday parties for kids.

The new HAWS Shallock Center for Animals in Delafield is exciting because it opens up all kinds of possibilities for our department to expand...and even create new programs!

Our first big program to debut at the Center will be an expanded Kids 'N Critters Summer Camp. We are excited to be able to offer summer camp sessions this year both at our main shelter facility in Waukesha and at the Shallock Center. Plus, the Delafield property will present some new opportunities and activities for campers.

Seventy-seven acres of property means that campers walking dogs will have a variety of trails to experience, and be able to observe the difference in the dog's behavior in varying environments. Instead of doing the same route each day, our campers and dogs will have new places to explore.

The property lends itself to many of our activities and games being played outside, giving campers ample space to spread out. Pet Care Relay and Pet Supply Scavenger Hunt will cover more area – and be given a fresh twist!

The natural setting of the Shallock Center means we can expand our offerings of environmental activities. Safe access to

a pond, a field and wooded areas allows us to talk about different types of habitats and the animals living there, while actually exploring those areas and observing either the animals or signs of the animals on site. Campers will learn about a variety of native Wisconsin species such as deer, coyotes, raccoons, leopard frogs and red-tailed hawks.

We plan for the Shallock Center to become a desirable destination for field trips by schools throughout southeastern Wisconsin. With the amount of indoor and outdoor space at the Center, we will be able to host large numbers of students and offer curriculum from Wisconsin's Department of Instruction. Students will be able to participate in amazing hands-on learning sessions.

I am sure we will come up with even more innovative programs as we spend more time at the Shallock Center! This wonderful gift gives HAWS so many opportunities to engage with and educate our community, and we are excited for the endless possibilities! 🐾

SNIP UPDATE

It's Spay/Neuter Season!

Longer days and warmer temperatures are right around the corner. We will once again see flowers blooming, birds singing...and kittens multiplying! Every spring, HAWS' SNIP clinic receives many calls from people who find litters of kittens on their property or who are in need of assistance with cats roaming the area.

HAWS is here to help!

Through Project Guardian, HAWS offers no-charge spay/neuter surgery, rabies vaccination and an identifying ear notch for any outdoor cat in Waukesha County. Our services are also available to those living out-



side of Waukesha County, at a discounted rate. We offer additional services such as microchipping and FeLeuk/FIV testing, for a nominal fee. We offer flexibility in schedul-

ing throughout the week, with appointments available Monday through Friday. And, to meet our community's needs, we have recently increased the number of available outdoor cat spay/neuter appointments.

Got cats with nowhere to go? We have that covered, too! Through the generosity of area Boy and Girl Scout Troops, we often have free insulated cat houses available to those who need them. For properties with elusive felines, you can rent a humane trap from HAWS.

RESCUE TAILS...

Spring is here!

This time of year becomes increasingly busy with phone calls related to wildlife concerns. HAWS assists by picking up injured wildlife and transferring them to local, licensed rehabilitators.

Many of these calls are for baby/infant wildlife. It is important that, before we get involved, we verify the animal is indeed orphaned. Our most common calls are about fawns; often they will spend the entire day alone, in one spot, until mom returns at sunset. Baby birds do not know how to fly right away; as they develop that skill you will often find them on the ground. But, if you hear chaotic noises or a flurry of movement above, it is most likely the parent watching their offspring.

A wild animal's best chance of survival is to be raised by its parents in the wild, with minimal human contact unless absolutely necessary. Information is available from Wildlife in Need and the Wisconsin DNR, outlining if you should get involved and how to do that safely. If you are unsure of the best route to take, please don't hesitate to call HAWS!

is: Side-by-side training classes taking place in a large barn arena, with happy dogs and owners together against a gorgeous farm backdrop! (OPENING!)

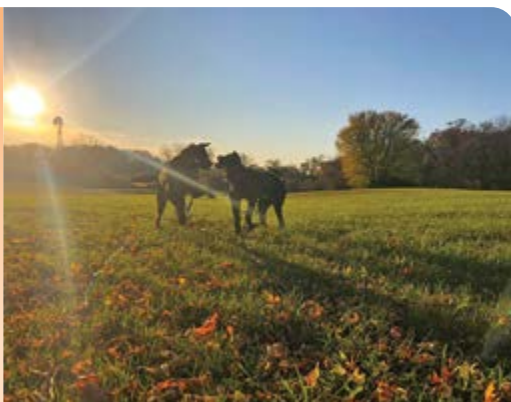
we mention...shhhh...agility training classes (anytime?)

and expansive in what we can offer, with the physical limitations of space to hold said programming. Now, with both HAWS main facility in Waukesha and the Schallock Center in Delafield, we are looking at a time when consultations, day training, training classes, and shelter Mod Squad dog work/field trips can all take place in both locations.

These opportunities will allow us to practice what we preach: Respite. Off-leash decompression. Social opportunities for play. Training with real-life distractions. Socialization opportunities. We have been given a gift that is unlike any other a shelter could imagine. And for the Behavior Department, most (if not all) of our programs will benefit tremendously from the opportunity to bring our clients to such a unique and private space, where we can control many variables to set up each dog for success.

For what it's worth, most dogs do not wish to leave once they get a chance to work and play at the Schallock Center...we cannot wait to show you what we've been working on! 🐾

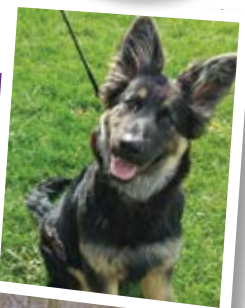

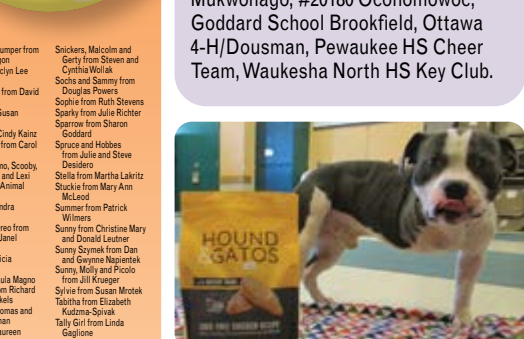
