

## Behavior Foster Homes Needed!

The Behavior Department at HAWS is looking for a unique set of foster homes, those that are willing to help with dogs who need a little extra support or who are not thriving in the shelter environment. Being a behavior foster parent will make a big difference for some of the most needy dogs at HAWS.

- Foster families will receive support from the Behavior Department every step of the way, including free inhome or virtual consultations. Each behavior foster dog is different and will come with a plan to help them thrive. Dogs may be labeled as a behavior foster for several different reasons, such as fearfulness or overstimulation with life in the shelter.
- Foster parents can expect to have their foster dogs for a minimum of two weeks, but for some cases, more time is needed.

#### January was National Train Your Dog Month, but why limit training just to January? HAWS has a full slate of training classes available, for all stages of your dog's life! They include:

- Basic training: Life Skills for Puppies and Basic Manners 1.
- Next steps: Basic Manners 2, Manners Proofing, Canine Good Citizen (CGC), Come! (recall work) and two levels of Loose Leash Walking.
- Something different: Scent Work, clicker-based trick training (Clicks & Tricks), Treibball (soccer for dogs!) and Agility (keep an eye out for Agility "try-it" nights, too).
- Socialization/comfort classes: Sunday afternoon Puppy Parties, Cooperative Care.
- Day Training: Conducted both at our Waukesha shelter & the Schallock Center in Delafield.

His owner arrived shortly after and he is back home safe...probably looking for the opportunity to have yet another adventure...!






#### HAWS PET PANTRY

Volunteers are a vital part not only of our daily shelter work, but also as part of HAWS' outreach in our community!

We are looking to re-launch our in-shelter **Dog Enrichment Program,** and are now recruiting volunteers specifically to assist with enrichment. Duties would include working with dogs in different ways to help lower their stress while in HAWS' care. Examples of activities include reading to dogs inside or outside of the kennels, scent enrichment (bringing in a blanket from the cat laundry for them to smell), T-touch and different methods to help them calm themselves while in the kennel.

**Monday Manners** is back! There was a lot of interest from both veteran and rookie volunteers for our weekly in-shelter training program. Classes give volunteers a chance to help with the shelter dogs, and teach some basic manners. Two 45-minute classes are held every Monday morning, from 9:30-10:15am and from 10:30-11:15am.
