

At HAWS, we are grateful to be able to support so many pets (and their people!) at different stages of their lives. It never gets old greeting a transport of animals, witnessing a cat meet its forever family, watching a group of adoptable dogs zoom around in a playgroup, seeing a dog master a skill in Day Training. Similarly, it is an honor to

HAWS — when all hands are on deck to support an animal in need.



Visiting our SNIP clinic this morning I met a kitten who'd been stabilized after being struck by a car. One of our incredible vets made a makeshift sling for one of the kitten's adorable little legs to help him rest. All around, the clinic was buzzing with activity; our team kept a watchful eye on the kitten while continuing to attend to the animals on their roster for the day.

Yesterday I greeted a couple coming in to donate food and supplies after their longtime pet passed away. It was a beautiful way to honor the journey of their pet and family, and impact the journey of pets now awaiting their forever homes.

We recently wished "happy trails" to a dog who came to us as a stray, in need of major hip surgery. During his recovery, our team took turns supporting his physical therapy until he transitioned into a foster-to-adopt home.

Throughout the day, staff and volunteers bottle-feed countless kittens or diligently watch them in a brooder. Puppies are held and instinctively bounced or swayed rhythmically, small animal's heat lamps are adjusted...the list is endless.

Each stage and contribution to an animal's care is important and shapes that animal's journey; a daily testament to our mission. As an open admission shelter, HAWS welcomes pets each time they need us, as many times as they need us, throughout their journey.

In both the joyful and challenging times, I'm struck by all that our team of volunteers and staff do each day to support the journeys of the more than 11,000 pets HAWS supports each year.



9:00am: While our front doors may have just been unlocked and opened for the day, HAWS has already been a hive of activity for several hours. Kennel caregivers and the SNIP clinic team have been busy bringing the shelter to life, greeting the current residents and prepping for the day ahead. Adoption counselors are busy managing animal accounts, assorted paperwork and a lengthy list of emails and other messages. Let the chaos begin!

9:20am: The first official intake of the morning arrives - a lost dog brought in by local law enforcement. Our overnight on-call team had received word from neighbors that a pup was wandering, but he eluded all attempts at capture. In this case, the officer had a stroke of luck and the dog jumped right into his patrol car, apparently finally tired from the chase. A quick scan finds the dog is microchipped, yay! After a call from our team with all the details, his family will be in shortly to claim him.

10:05am: A different story for the stray cat from a week ago: with no owners coming forward, she is now in line for spay surgery today, so she can be placed up for adoption and find a new loving home. In the meantime, caregivers have been loving up on this shy, sweet cat, bringing her out of her shell just in time for her debut in the adoption ward. Volunteers prep her new cubby.

11:00am: HAWS' Education team welcomes a group of very excited middle schoolers, eager to tour the facility, and learn about the animals and what we do each day. A mostly excited murmur goes through the room when education ambassador Kaa, a ball python, arrives for a meet'n'greet. Next up, a rabbit, a few kittens and a puppy!

11:15am: Since all the dogs have been walked, it is now playgroup time for the HAWS adoptables! Volunteers bring several dogs at a time to the special fenced yard, to observe and facilitate a much-appreciated romp in the fresh air. Those not in the group get important one-on-one time, working on manners skills - and getting snuggles.

12:00pm-ish: Lunchtime! The kennel quiets for a bit while the dogs and cats dig in. (The small animals have been munching all morning, thanks to their caregivers.)

1:00pm: Viewing hours have begun! The kennels are all clean and fresh, and the pets are enjoying full tummies, wondering if this is the day one of the visitors who walks through will decide they are the perfect match. They also watch with anticipation as the Marketing team takes video and photos. Who will be the next social media or television sensation?



3:35pm: A bell rings in the lobby and a buzz spreads throughout the building as a long-term resident is being adopted. Staff and volunteers drop what they're doing to bid the pet a fond farewell and remind the new family to send pictures of that pet in their home, loving life. Nothing makes us happier than a great update!

4:10pm: Dog walking, round 2! Now that food come has worn off, naptime is over and it's time to get outside again and sniff everything that has changed since, well, a few hours ago. And, the cats in the lobby condos and those with windows overlooking the front entryway and vestibule need something amusing to watch. Enrichment for all!

HAWS wellness visit

5:00pm: As viewing hours end, a few last adoptions are happening! Someone has come in for not one but two of our turtles. The bonded pair of guinea pigs is being officially adopted by a teacher who fostered them in her classroom. Education staff are prepping for tomorrow's in-school program visit. The volunteers are handing out appropriate treats and chew toys for the evening. The last SNIP patient has been cleared from recovery. Fund Development staff heads to a radio station to do an interview and live social stream. Staff sweeps and mops up the lobby.

6:30pm: The day isn't over yet! Behavior staffers are getting the rooms ready for tonight's training classes. Volunteers brainstorm ideas to support the animals - is there a need for a certain type of equipment? At the same time a group of staff and community members are meeting to plan this year's fall fundraising gala. What items were popular in last year's auction?

9:00pm: Dogs, cats and small animals are safe in their kennels and habitats - most sleeping peacefully, but a few nocturnal ones are making busy noises. An Animal Rescue team member answers a phone call for a pet in distress. Yes, tomorrow is another day, but there are still a few hours left in today.....



Future Humane Heroes Notes from Megan J., Education Dept. Manager

Notes from Megan J.,

HAWS' Education department may not directly handle adoptions, but we certainly facilitate an animal's journey in other ways!

HAWS' curriculum centers on the importance of humane, authentic, compassionate future leaders, and what HAWS does to that end. We promote the importance of animal rescue. We illustrate how people who prefer specific breeds of animals and their traits can actually find those in the shelter. We talk about the importance of doing research before adopting ANYTHING to make sure A) you can meet the animals' needs, and B) it fits into your lifestyle. We play games and do activities to show the average cost of owning an animal including food, vet care, habitat and time.

We also talk about how detrimental it is for any animal to end up in a shelter and why the shelter environment is not ideal for any animal. We explain the resources we offer at HAWS including training and spay/neuter, showing how fast an unspayed female cat can create an unwanted colony. We show that animals adopted from a shelter are always spayed/neutered, microchipped, vaccinated...all included in the price of adoption!

The best part? Usually during one of our programs - summer camp, general tours, birthday parties - someone ends up falling in love with something (see Jack's story)! The result may be an adoption, or it ignites a light in the kids to want to change the world and preach about everything they've learned during their time at HAWS.






HAWS Herd News


