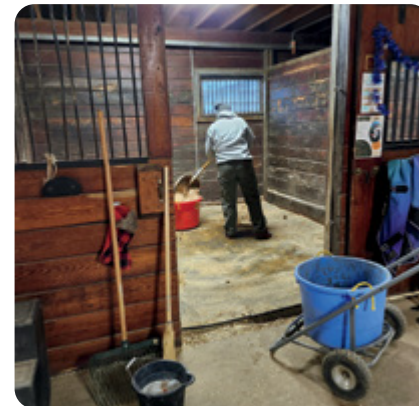
Since HAWS was formed in 1965, we've continued to grow and evolve to meet the needs of pets and our community. Fulfilling a long-standing vision of the organization and two of our founding members, Mike and Jane Schallock, we opened our HAWS Schallock Center for Animals in Delafield in 2021. Mike and Jane gifted this beautiful property to HAWS and with it, their vision for it to be dedicated to the education of future generations in humane values and sentiments. We proudly added new members to our pack – horses living at the Center. Our “pack” became a “herd.”

With these beautiful creatures as a cornerstone of Mike and Jane's vision, the “HAWS Herd” has opened many a door, contributing to our humane community. Our equine programs go beyond general riding lessons, welcoming both youth and adults, reaching those who otherwise may be without in-depth access to horses. Hands-on experiences with the horses include:

- Classes based on caring for and growing a deep knowledge of, with interactions
- Programs building confidence in young readers
- Opportunities to care for horses and maintain a barn – strengthening work ethic and leadership; skill-building for scout groups
- Sessions for youth who have experienced a loss in their life
- Exposure to career opportunities with horses
- Summer camp and school field trip memories for thousands of children
- Team building for local groups and corporations through on-site projects.

While you cannot adopt one of our horses like you can adopt a pet at our Waukesha shelter, you can contribute to our founders' vision by caring for our horses and learning from them. Caring for an animal that is bigger than us is, well, bigger than us.

Our herd has become key to our work in growing a humane community. The trust, communication and teamwork that is required between human and horse is profound and can make a lasting impact on how one views themselves and the community around them. I'm so proud of our team of staff and volunteers that are dedicated to working with these incredible animals and sharing them with the community. We're not a riding facility – we strive to emphasize and grow the relationship between horses and humans. I invite you to join us in learning more about our equine programs and ways to get involved, and meet this magnificent herd for yourself! 🐾



**Volunteer “Herd”**

Our equine programs are only possible with teamwork! Both the horses themselves and horse staff work together to provide participants with a safe, fun experience. We wouldn't be able to have the HAWS Herd without our amazing volunteers coming together to help care for them.

Working in a barn isn't always easy, especially during less-than-ideal weather, so we truly appreciate the hard work. The group from Lad Lake is a prime example. These young men come once a week to help do morning chores, and then have the opportunity to interact with the horses and goats for the second half of their visit. During the time the entire barn roof was being replaced, we couldn't access hay with a large machine and had to move flakes of hay manually. The Lad Lake students jumped right in and worked together carrying hay to where we needed it...even when the horses decided to do some taste-testing and “helping” of their own. We enjoy having the Lad Lake team come each week and are happy to see them gradually become more comfortable and confident with the animals. 🐾

# Meet the

## Long before it became the HAWS

Schallock Center for Animals, our facility in Delafield was a haven for horses called Star Hill Farm. Jane and Mike Schallock, luminaries in the Saddlebred community and two of HAWS' founders, cultivated the 77-acre property for their passion – owning, boarding and training these beautiful creatures. Dozens of horses spent their lives at Star Hill, showing in the arena, grazing the rolling pasture and exploring the wooded trails.

When HAWS became the guardians of the property in 2019, we held on to the idea of it again being a home to horses. We knew we could make it happen with the right people.

Horses returned to Star Hill in June of 2021, with the arrivals of Cal, Ranger and Equine Specialist Makayla. A short time later, the HAWS Schallock Center for Animals welcomed Monet and Big Sur, along with repeat summer residents and kids camp "assistants" Dottie and Ameeka.

Along with hellos we have also had to say natural goodbyes to some of the loved residents. But, today the HAWS Herd stands strong! It still includes Ranger, who has been joined by Blue, Stella, Coco and Cody, as well as Chincoteague Pony Skittles and Miniature-Horse Candy Corn. They are key members of our Education department, providing unique, all-ages equine programs centered on awareness and understanding of an animal that is not accessible to many people.

The horses have arrived at HAWS in many different ways - through staff and volunteer connections, from other educational facilities, and even via Facebook! They've become family, and we are thrilled to have them.

Don't forget the goats! HAWS "inherited" a comedic trio of Bucky Jo, Mike and Ike. While Bucky Jo sadly passed a few years ago, a new threesome named Curly, Moe and Larry joined original residents Mike and Ike to fill the goat habitat and provide edu-tainment to summer campers, family program visitors and students on field trips to the property.

It is hard to remember what life was like for HAWS prior to our Schallock Center for Animals and the Herd! This facility and these amazing animals have become such an integral part of our mission and programming.

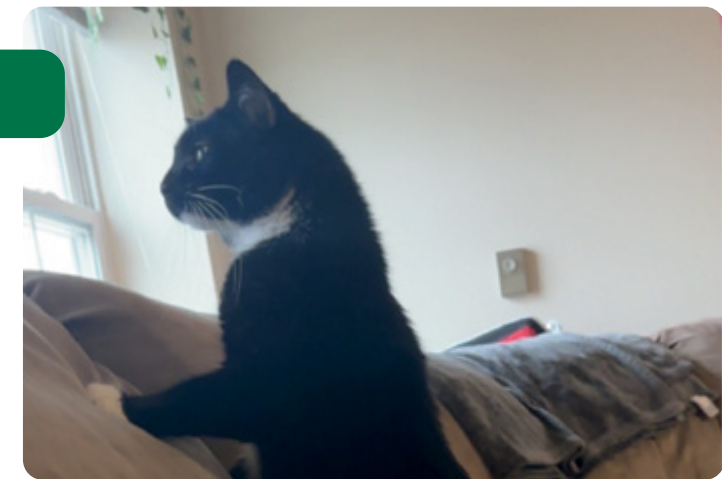

## CONGRATS TO TREVOR LIM, 2024 WINNER EMMA'S INSPIRATION AWARD

Each year, along with the Emma Loves Dogs Foundation, HAWS recognizes a young person who reminds us of Emma Mertens and strives to spread kindness to animals and the community.

From the nomination form on Trevor's behalf:

Trevor always exhibits kindness and eagerness to help others. He is a member of Milwaukee Youth Symphony Orchestra with violin as his primary instrument. He had heard that animal shelters are always in need of donations and being a 10-year-old with no reliable income, he decided that he could raise money for HAWS by busking on the street with his violin. He soon realized that busking on the street is not as easy as just taking out the violin and playing. He had to first select a few locations, talk to the owners of the stores around the area and then finally get their permission to perform. While he was nervous about the entire process, he was able to accomplish it all by himself (with minimal support from us) without giving up because of his strong desire to help animals in need. Coupled with the overwhelming support and kindness from the community, he was able to successfully raise a good sum of funds to purchase and donate items from HAWS' Wish List. In fact, he has been talking about doing a similar thing again.

## Partners and Permanent Pairs

Since 2019, **HAWS and Carroll University** have partnered to pair animal behavior students with foster dogs. As part of Carroll's advanced skills in canine management and training course, the adoptable dogs live with students for an entire semester. This unique partnership offers dogs awaiting their forever homes the opportunity to leave the shelter setting while simultaneously helping students develop real-world skills for their future roles as animal behavior professionals.

“Graduation” (adoption) day arrives at the end of each semester. The new adoptive homes are screened by the students, giving them yet another skill for their future careers. Forever homes have included family, friends – and even the students themselves! This past semester, we had an especially wonderful outcome: student Nikki and foster dog Jade (who was a long-term HAWS resident) made a lasting connection, ending with Nikki adopting Jade permanently!

Jade was able to make the most improvement outside the shelter environment. When she became part of the Carroll program, her student was willing to commit to Jade and her needs with routine, structure, and consistent and focused attention.

Nikki shared lots of insight about their time together:  
*The program overall was an incredible and very unique experience with all the support that we could possibly need.*

*Jade continues to thrive and grow. She's become more playful, full of love...and has amazing talents that we are discovering together. She is sweet around people and everyone she meets instantly loves her, which warms my heart. She also still carries an emotional support toy when we go for walks, making me smile.*

*Jade is thriving at my home. She has claimed her favorite chair, and her favorite time of day is snuggle time. She is showing her goofy side so much with playing with her toys. She has a huge backyard to run in, and my family has gotten her numerous puzzle toys which she loves to solve. She fits in like an absolute dream. She thrives on stability and love, and here she has plenty of love to both give and receive. I'm incredibly thankful to have her in my life. 🐾*

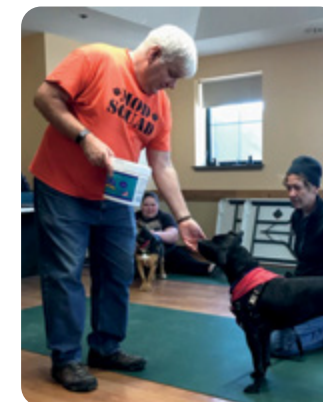
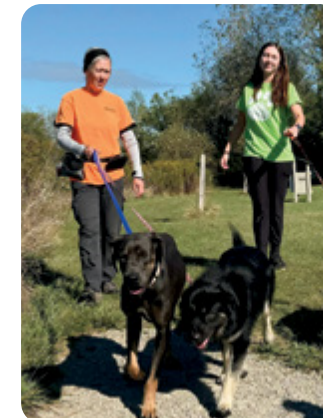

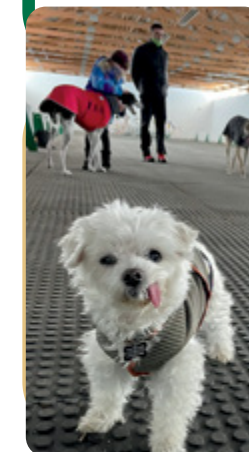

## “Herd” on the Town

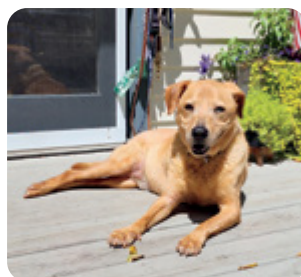
Our **Dog Walker Outings** program allows volunteers to take a fur-friend on an adventure. Whether to Home Depot, Starbucks for a Pup Cup, or a park for play time, Outings offer an opportunity to give further enrichment to the dogs in HAWS’ care.

Dog Walking Facilitators and Mentors help promote the Outings information to new volunteers. We have seen success in the Outings program with our active volunteer pool, and are excited to open this program to new volunteers as well! This opportunity would not be possible without the support from our Dog Walkers, Mentors and Facilitators, adapting to the needs of our dogs to ensure that they have the best possible experience while waiting for adoptive homes.

HAWS’ Dog Walker Elizabeth P. shared her experience with adoptable dog Kodak: *I had the privilege to take Kodak out for the day. What had drawn me to him was the personality he showed while at the shelter. He was a quieter dog, though he loved when I would spend time with him sitting and scratching his head in his kennel. Kodak also loved the outdoors so much when I would walk him. (During the car ride) he seemed so happy and satisfied – he had his head resting by the window, eyes closed, just enjoying it. While at Stein’s to let him pick out a new dog toy, he was clearly happy sniffing everything he could, with his tail wagging like crazy! Just the extra enrichment of being able to get out of his kennel for the day was truly impactful for this dog.*

*While we were out, I had also brought him to Starbucks, which he thoroughly enjoyed. After that day he became much more curious of his surroundings, and has grown quite affectionate towards me...comfortable enough to take a nap on my lap!*

*This was not only a good opportunity for me, making my heart so full of joy to be able to give a shelter dog this experience. It also had such a positive impact on Kodak. It gave him the opportunity to come out of his shy, shelter dog self and really explore the world, and also let him experience a positive interaction with a person. The day following our Outing he definitely seemed more trusting and at ease around me. The impact of the Dog Walker Outing is something I want to continue to spread to other shelter dogs, and I would highly encourage anyone else to get involved! 🐾*



Ducky was at a meeting with the HAWS Mobile team, greeting attendees. My wife and I instantly felt bad, since he was a nine-year-old who came in as a stray. We completed HAWS’ foster application and decided we’d take Ducky for a weekend to give him a vacation from the shelter. It didn’t take long and Ducky won the family over, making himself right at home. By Sunday night, we knew there was no way Ducky was going anywhere.

We completed the paperwork and officially adopted him. Ducky now lives his days sleeping on the porch, going for boat rides and indulging in Starbucks’ Pup Cups. He challenges his two-year-old coonhound brother, Walter, for the collection of the “cheese tax” and loves his daily walk around the block.

We’d encourage everyone to not immediately bypass the senior dogs. Ducky is already housebroken, has chill energy, and is just a great companion without the craziness and stress that often comes with a puppy. If you’re unsure, we encourage you to take advantage of HAWS’ weekend foster or Foster to Adopt programs and you just might find your own “Ducky.”

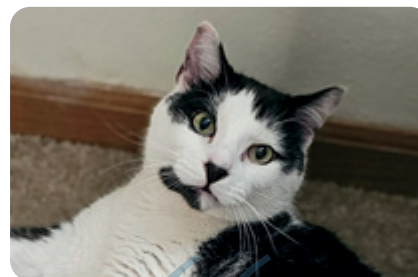

## Helping “Herd”

Throughout the year, **HAWS’ Outreach team** brings adoptable pets out to the community, to thank people who have supported our shelter financially, through supply drives and by doing projects. For us, it’s the best kind of “herd mentality” because one generous soul encourages the next, and pretty soon they have collected enough donations to fill our vans, or to purchase much-needed items for the shelter. We are so grateful for the positive impact that these “herd” members have on our animals, and for the community as a whole.

- ORBIS came to HAWS with bags filled with squeaker toys and treats. Adoptable pets were able pick out their own toy to take home!
- Kohl’s volunteers made 500 goody bags, “pupcakes” and cut-out cookies for shelter pets. A group also decorated the Schallock Center house and barn for the holidays!
- The Inpro team put together Kuranda-style beds, for our dogs to have a comfy spot in their kennels.

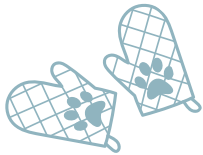
